CRISTIN RICHARD *DOMESTICATE ME*

Opening Saturday April 2nd 2011 from 2pm to 8pm
With Lydie Vareilhes from Opéra de Paris

La Découpe is pleased to present *Domesticate me*, the first exhibition in France of Cristin Richard, a young American artist from Detroit, Michigan.

Using sculpture, Cristin Richard investigates a wide range of artistic, psychological and sociological topics. Her works question identity, female sexuality and standards.

Inspired by Magdalena Abakanowicz and Eva Hesse, she is particularly interested in using raw materials as a sensual communication tool. With an amazing attention to detail, Cristin Richard turns her favorite material (sausage casing) into delicate dresses, lingerie and high heel shoes...

Experimenting with colour, texture and transparency allows her to transform that repulsive material into something beautiful. Her sculptures are often complex metaphors of women's roles in society. Some pieces by Cristin Richard can also be worn, which transforms that experience into a whole performance. Furthermore, a unique performance will be presented during the opening, on Saturday April 2nd, on a music composed by Czarling.

For her exhibition at La Découpe, and after a month of residence, the artist has chosen to introduce unique and original pieces, ironically questioning the duties of the housewife. Her works, based around the idea of domestication of the female body in its interior, will be presented in different rooms of the apartment / gallery.

Cristin Richard was born in 1981 in Detroit (MI), USA, where she currently lives and works. She has taken part in many art shows in the States and her work is amongst several major American collections..

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"CASING COUTURE" CRISTIN RICHARD'S HOUSE OF RAW (EXTRACTS)



Richard initially studied Industrial Design at College for Creative Studies (Detroit, MI), then switched into the world of Fibers. Through instructor Susan Aaron-Taylor's direction, she experimented with all types of mediums for design.

"She basically told us that everything around you is fiber and you can work with anything. That's where you're like, 'OK, let me see what I can do with this.' That's always kind of interested me – the whole idea of playing with your food, it's creepy in itself. It was great to take a material and handle it, manipulate it, transform it. It's that process of starting from scratch and making something, and that's what really got me into the casing."

Making clothing from casing, hadn't occurred until she visited an exhibit at the Detroit Institute of Arts Museum, featuring a translucent Inuit parka made from seal intestines, adorned with feathers and other natural materials.

"I really got into, 'How'd they do that? Why'd they do that?'" she says.

"Basically, like, they killed an animal and they could use anything. They wouldn't waste any bones, or they would carve those into tools, and the intestines just happened to be waterproof because they're from a water creature and they worked out well, so I tried to do the same sort of deal with playing around with cow and pig intestines. It took a while for me to try to figure out how to manipulate the material. I really loved how when it dried you can see the veins, all the weird inconsistencies. I like the fact that not everybody can work with it, too – like a lot of people get creeped out by it, so I can take ownership of it."
